Going Forth

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Bubbles

See the bubbles in the air, catch them, pop them, blow some more. Coloured bubbles rise in tubes. Blow through straws and catch bubbles on paper plates

Water gels

Dip your hands in bubble bowls and feel them wobble and slide as underneath coloured lights glow through them

Fibre optics

Lights dim and coloured dream torches dance in the dark. A fibre optic character appears and encourages you to dance with his friends (projected on wall)

To Do: Bubble prints are fun, just mix washing up liquid, paint and water and blow with a straw, then put paper on top to print, or paint colours onto bubble wrap. Put drops of food colouring into milk then hold a cotton bud coated with soap still in middle and watch the colours move. To make a 'lava lamp' see website below

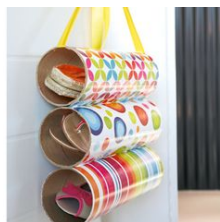
Cathedral

An old cardboard box can quickly be turned into a house - put tealights inside. Or try making your own stained glass windows (see website below)

To Do: Visit a living rainforest (<http://www.livingrainforest.org/visit/>) or create your own with giant palm leaves, snakes and insects. Decorate 'clapsticks' or stones and tap together to make rhythms
